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CITY OF URBANA ASKS YOUR HELP IN PRIORITIZING FUTURE SPENDING

The City of Urbana will be hosting in-person and on-line interactive activities on the five themes identified in the initial community engagement phase of the City's *Imagine Urbana* Comprehensive Plan update process. The second phase of Imagine Urbana community engagement will get underway in June 2023. Andrea Ruedi, Senior Advisor for Integrated Strategy Development, stated, "The primary focus of the Comprehensive Plan update's next phase of community engagement will be the public's participation in simulated "spending priorities" activities. Interactive scenario simulation software will allow participants to immediately see the impact of their decisions and ultimately help the City determine how best to accomplish what the community has prioritized."

The public can access the on-line activity anytime through July 31, 2023, at https://lmagineUrbana.com/balancingfutureproposals to provide their priorities to the City. To walk through the on-line spending priority activities with City staff, the public is invited to join any of three webinars for a 15-minute demonstration, followed by an open session for participants to ask specific questions.
