• Staff Report - Rachel L Storm, Urbana Arts and Culture Coordinator

Storm presented the monthly staff report. Topics included an overview of accomplishments made by summer interns, virtual events, and programs hosted and upcoming by 2019/2020 Urbana Arts Grantees. The report also detailed the Urbana Arts and Culture Program's involvement in local initiatives, including Art for Nourishment (in collaboration with The Bucket Brigade, Silver Hearts, and The Tiger Market of Urbana School District #116,) Art Inspired (in collaboration with The Urbana Free Library,) Teen Artists Reimagine the World (in collaboration with Chambanamoms, Krannert Art Museum, KOOP Adventure Play, Museum of the Grant Prairie, and a number of youth community groups,) and The Great ARTdoors (a collaboration with 40 North, Champaign Park District, Urbana Park District, and Spurlock Museum.) Other items included the Urbana Poet Laureate, Will Reger, and his ongoing initiatives, as well as the mention of the intent to launch a Youth Poet Laureate Program. An update on sculptures was also included in the report.

Arts & Culture Interns Max Pociask, Madeline Molina, and Celia Barbieri, gave a brief presentation covering their achievements and personal reflections while involved with the Arts and Culture Internship Program, sponsored by the Illinois Arts Council Summer Youth Employment Program.

• COVID-19 Impact on Urbana's Arts and Culture Program

Storm reported that Urbana's Arts and Culture Program continues to have a suspension of in-person programs with the exception of small and socially-distanced gatherings. The program staff is working remotely while the City building remains closed to the public. An updated list of artist relief programs has also been added to the City website.
