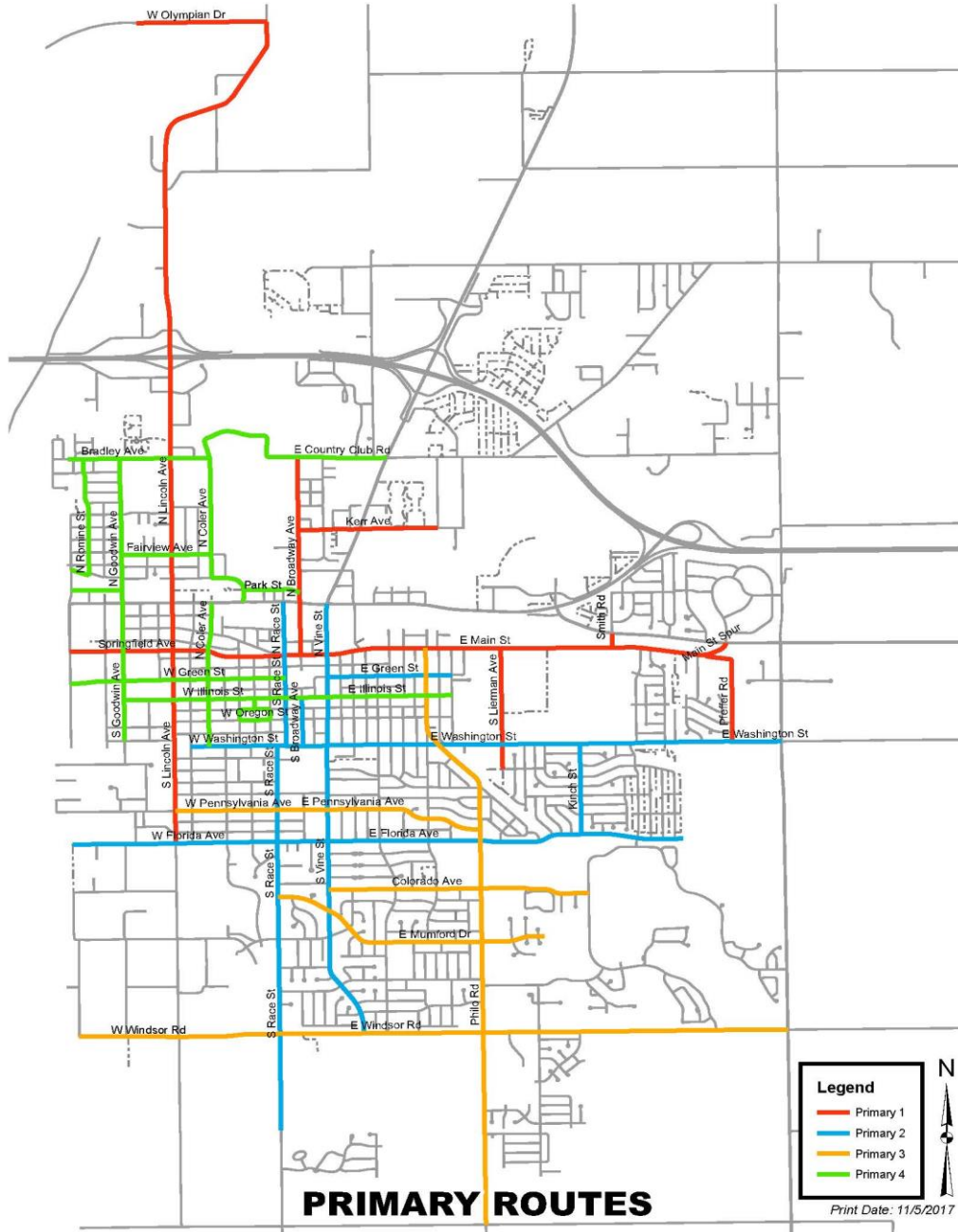

SNOW REMOVAL

- Activities are dependent on the weather conditions for each snow event
 - TREATMENT when there is less than 2 inches of accumulation expected
 - PLOWING operations when accumulation exceeds 2 inches
- Roads are prioritized for snow and ice removal
 - High-volume arterials
 - Downtown and Philo Road Business Districts, public parking lots
 - Residential areas
- 12 Snow Fighters per 12 hour period
- 23 pieces of Snow Equipment
- 300 Lane Miles of Roadway
- \$140,000 Snow Budget

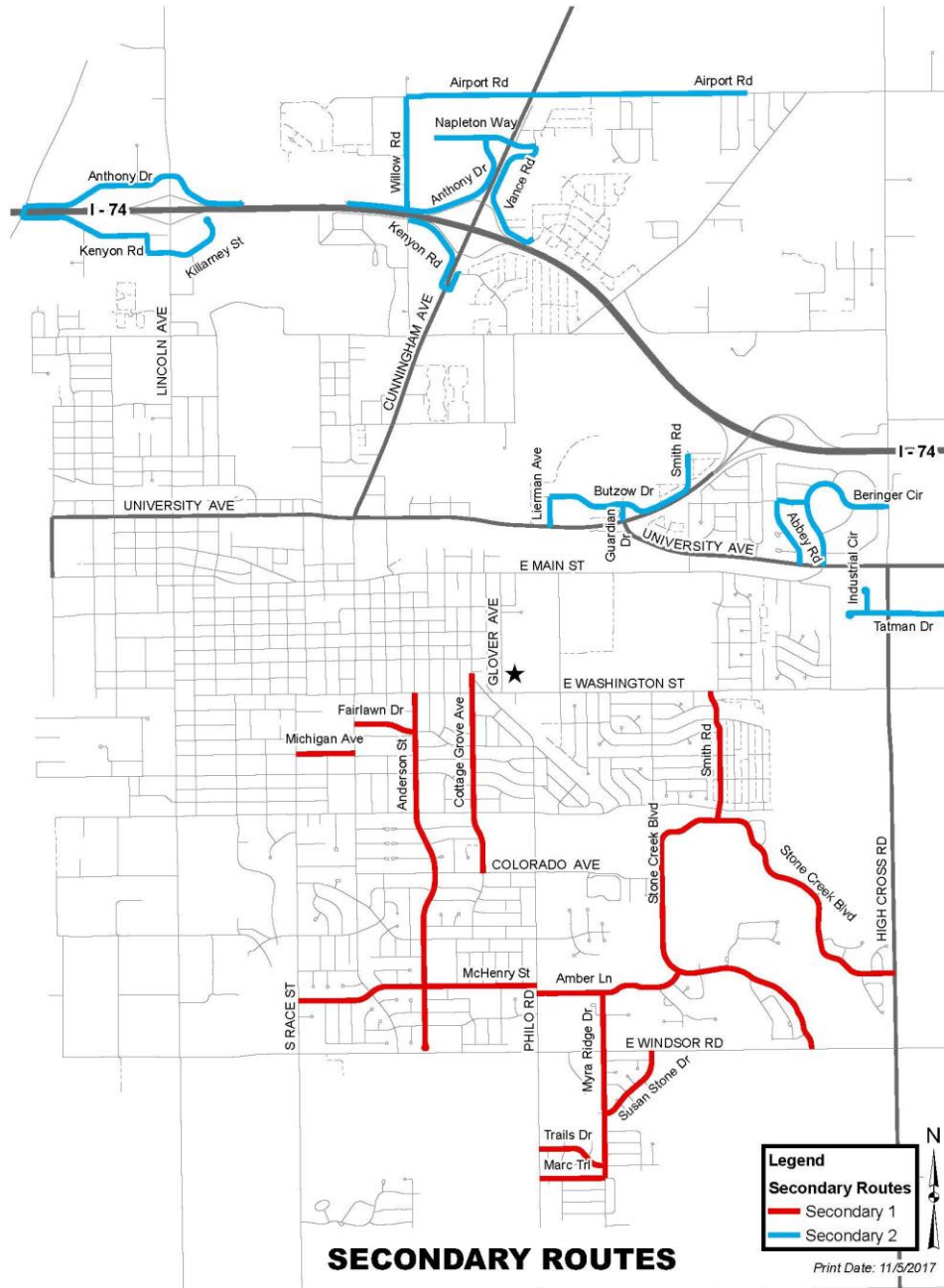


PRIMARY ROUTES

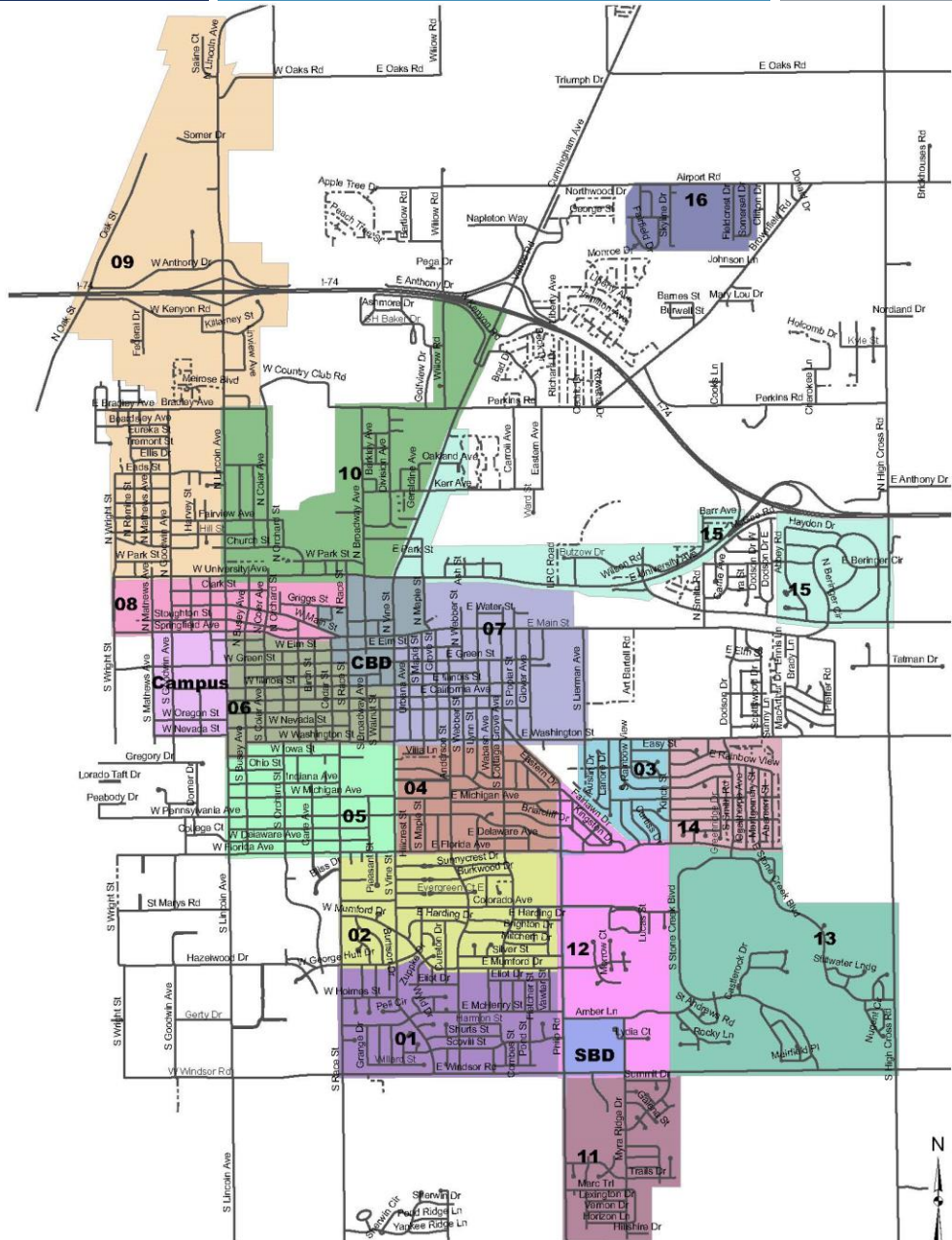

RESIDENTIAL AREAS

- Typically all residential streets will be plowed within 20 hours after the end of the snowstorm
- Dead-end streets and cul-de-sacs are cleared as equipment becomes available
- Public residential alleys that require access are plowed only after 5 inches of snow has accumulated
- Removing snow from driveways is the responsibility of the resident
- The City is divided into 16 residential zones that are cleared on a systematic rotational basis every year.



RESIDENTIAL INDEX

SIDEWALKS

- The Public Works Department removes all snow and ice from sidewalks adjacent to City owned buildings and property
- Sidewalks adjacent to private property are the responsibility of the homeowner
- The Urbana City Council passed an ordinance on January 5, 2011 that requires property owners within identified snow removal districts to clear the adjacent public sidewalk of snow and ice
 - Clearance must occur within 24 hours of a declaration made by the Public Works Director

2020-21 NOTABLE ITEMS

- COVID-19
 - Enhanced vehicle cleaning procedures
 - Encouraging the following of CDC guidelines to ensure staff is healthy and available
- Salt Prices have normalized this year
 - 2019- \$106/ton due to Mississippi River Flooding interrupting barges
 - 2020- 1400 tons purchased at \$46/ton
- New plow trucks
 - The City purchased 6 new plow trucks
 - Previous fleet was over 10 years old
