- Baking and giving treats to local first responders
- · Gathering 200 gallons of trash and recycling
- Helping neighbors recover from surgery
- Delivering greeting cards to senior citizens during holidays

The Mayoral Recognition Program is open to any UHS student who completes 30 hours of volunteer service during the academic year. Students who complete at least 30 service hours will receive a Certificate of Service from Mayor Marlin, Superintendent Dr. Ivory-Tatum, and UHS Principal Jesse Guzman.
